We've also begun an educational campaign this quarter emphasizing the importance of getting idle Action Gaming enhanced poker EPROMs back to us. If we don't get the unused chips back, the bills continue. We're also working hard to improve the billing process, in an effort to reduce the number of mistakes and unexpected "back bills" you may sometimes receive. When we get the old, unused chips back and log them into our system, those bills stop immediately. We recently mailed a laminated "How to Return Multi-hand Poker Chips Cheat Sheet" to all of our customers, and we hope you will make sure that the person you put in charge of returning these EPROMs reads it and understands how important it is to get those chips back to us.

On the product side, we were all very proud to see that our *Chase The Royal* game took second

place in the most innovative game category this year at the American Gaming Summit 2002 awards competition. This theme is out in the field now where players can become acquainted with it, and we'll soon see if they like it as much as the panel!

Also in this issue, get ready for the *Austin Powers*<sup>TM</sup> *Poker* game, coming soon. Not a video slot – this is poker! It's a very cool game that comes in standard multi-hand play style, enhanced by Austin material and a couple of groovy bonus games that Bob Dancer loves and is writing about in *Strictly Slots* magazine. ## Simplifying The Multi-Hand Poker Process . . .

You said it. You're right. And we agree with you: signing a separate contract for each and every single transaction — whether it's a swap or the conversion of a new game — is way too much work! Recently we sent out a new "Master Agreement" for all of our multi-hand poker products including *Triple Play Draw Poker*, *Hundred Play Draw Poker*, and the like.

The new agreement will enable us to keep the "master" contract on file and all future changes – once you have the new agreement on file – will be done on a simple one-page supplement. This should streamline things at your end and ours. We appreciate all of the positive feedback we've received regarding this improvement in the process. Please keep those suggestions coming!

Another area we've examined is the procedures for tracking EPROMs, and making the billing process more accurate. Surprisingly, we found that many customers have been uncertain of what to do with unused multi-hand poker EPROMs, which explains why we often have billing confusion at the end of the month.

The multi-hand poker product line is unique in that Action Gaming – from whom we license the multi-hand poker

patents – expects to get paid for all the chips that are in the field. As the licensor of their games, IGT is forced to serve as bill collector, bean counter, and shepherd for all those itty-bitty chips out there! We are the "go-between" for all active chips in the field, as well as those that aren't being used, those sitting on a shelf, or that are in transit.

If you've ever wondered why we sometimes make billing errors, it's usually a direct result of so much "manual" counting of EPROMs, and our need to know where they are and whether they are "active" or not. One of the easiest ways to make the billing more accurate is to promptly return any unused or idle chips back to us. Often the importance of their return is not emphasized. However, until we receive them back and log them as "returned," our

accounting computers think they're still out there and "active."

This can result in the accounting computers printing bills that charge for more chips than you actually have installed on the floor. Then we play the "he said, she said," credit/debit game, which is a nuisance for everyone involved. The multihand poker contracts do state that unused chips must be sent back to us in order for billing to cease. Sometimes this point gets lost between the Slot Operations office and the tech shop.

To bridge that gap, we're trying to help in a couple of ways. We recently sent all of our clients a laminated sheet with "how to" instructions for the return of chips, and a toll-free number to call when questions arise (1-888-777-5101). Please post this in your tech shop so you'll find it easier to return EPROMs. This should ultimately also improve the billing situation. We're also making coffee coasters with the message, "Return Your Unused Chips," to serve as a reminder. These will be sent to you in April, and we hope these extra steps we're taking help.

### It's in the Cards for *Austin Powers™ Poker*



The *Deuces Wild Bonus Poker* theme is one of the video poker games where the correct strategy differs a lot depending upon which exact pay schedule you find on the machine. Let's compare two separate pay schedules as an example:

The chart lists the one-coin returns for each game – except for the royal flush, which shows the proportionate one-coin return assuming you play maximum coins. Here we see two games found in all parts of the country, each returning almost exactly the same amount for optimal play. Although these pay schedules would be considered "tight" by the standards of Las Vegas casinos, they would be considered "loose" in many other places.

The part of the pay schedule that makes the biggest difference in the strategy is high-lighted in the table. The first game is labeled 4-4-3, because those are the values in the highlighted area. Similarly, the second game is labeled 5-3-2.

Here are five everyday hands to play. We'll save some tougher hands for Part II of this *Deuces Wild Bonus Poker* paytable comparison, scheduled for the next issue of *The Inside Straight* newsletter. Your assignment, should you decide to accept it, is to play each of these hands against each of the pay schedules. See how your strategy changes!

Note that no suits are shown for wild deuces, as these cards are an exact substitute for any other card of any suit.

Game variations add spice to the video poker experience, and offer players interesting paytable possibilities. The *Deuces Wild Bonus Poker* game is wildly popular, and features a paytable structure that is pleasantly different from any other poker game.

One note of caution: if you've been playing another game and decide to try your luck with *Deuces Wild Bonus Poker*, it'll pay you to spend a minute or two studying the paytable so you can adjust your play strategy accordingly. Here are the odds of receiving a paying hand on the deal, and on the draw . . .

Using the Full House (FH) in this example, a player would expect to be dealt a FH once every 205 hands on average. The same player would expect a FH after the deal and subsequent draw every 38 games on average. This compares with a draw average of 87 games for *Jacks or Better Poker*, and a 92-game draw average for *Double Double Bonus Poker*.

**Note:** the "DRAW" column was calculated using the optimal playing strategy for a standard 99.7% *Deuces Wild Bonus Poker* paytable. The "DRAW" column varies from paytable to paytable due to changes in optimal playing strategy.

agement enhances the thrill of receiving a winning hand on the deal, and adds an extra measure of anticipation to the game.

That's 40 extra hands for free! Players will love this opportunity to nail the elusive royal flush.

Bob Dancer, an industry expert on video poker, recently played both games in our lab





and had this to say: "I enjoyed playing these games..." and "I liked both versions [of the *Austin Powers™ Poker* bonus games] for different reasons. The *Mini-Me* bonus gets you to the bonus round much



more quickly, but the possible bonuses are 'only' on four-of-a-kind. *The Ten Play Draw Poker Number Two* bonus game regularly gives you 50 pops at a 1,080-to-1 royal flush."

#### Dancer's Answers

(Answers to the *Deuces Wild Bonus Poker* game quiz on page 3)

In each case I list the correct answer and how much more it is worth than the second best answer – assuming you are playing max coins on a dollar machine.

**A1:** KKJJ in 4-4-3 (67¢) and KK or JJ in 5-3-2 (24¢). The critical factor here is how much the full house returns. When the full house returns four-per-coin-bet, go with the two pair. When it only returns three, pick either pair but not both, and shoot for a four-of-a-kind or better.

**A2:** 678 in 4-4-3 (18¢) and 6789 in 5-3-2 (6¢). The dissimilar return for the same flush makes all of the difference here.

**A3:** 2678A in 4-4-3 (\$3.51) and 2678 in 5-3-2 (\$1.06). The difference in the value of the flush strikes again.

**A4:** 2256 in 4-4-3 (22¢) and 22 in 5-3-2 (45¢). Don't even think about holding a straight with two wild deuces showing in either game. That error would be worth more than \$5.

**A5:** KQJT in 4-4-3 (\$53.93) and KQJT in 5-3-2 (\$51.17). This is a classic nerve-racking choice. Is it right to be a "gambler" and go for the royal? Or be a "chicken" and keep the straight flush?

Deuces Wild Bonus Poker is the only game in video poker where the "gambler" choice is correct on this hand. This is, keep four-card royal flush over a five-card straight flush. The reason, of course, is the relatively low value of the straight flush in this game. On a five-coin basis, the four-card roayla is worth between \$96 and \$99 (depending on the pay schedule). When you compare that to a \$45 straight flush, it's not contest. In most other video poker games, the value of the four-card royal is similar, but the value of the dealth straight flush is \$250. it's right to be a "chicken" in those games!

Well, how did you do? These weren't particularly tough hands. Remember, the average reader of this newsletter is smarter and more educated than the average player in the casino. if you can't get a perfect score, think how hard it is for them! This is why these games traditionally hold more than 2% better than optimum. Many players know these games are looser than slots – and are attracted to them for that very reason. But knowing that and being able to play accurately are two different things.



How are some Video Poker of the newer poker games being received in the real world? We asked Marcus
Suan, Corporate Vice President of Slot Marketing for Coast

**IGT:** Why do you think *Triple Play Poker* and other multi-hand poker games have stayed so popular for so long?

Resorts, to share some of his experiences.

**Suan:** "My theory is bottom line, new items are coming out every week in the video slot type of machines. The *Triple Play Poker* game is unique. Someone is not coming out every day with a new triple-play machine."

**IGT:** Do you notice any trends occurring in the poker market?

**Suan:** "The only trend I see is Action Gaming and its trend... it's basically been the same exact item for 15 years. I don't know what all we can do with it and the new types... They're a bit too complicated and a little cumbersome. I think the basic program is here to stay, unless someone comes out with another triple-play type of machine. So no, I don't see a trend developing."

**IGT:** Several years ago, bill acceptors on slot machines created a revolution in casino currency handling. Today, our *EZ Pay* Ticket System is taking cash handling technology to the next level. How have your players taken to using *EZ Pay* tickets?

**Suan:** "We opened Suncoast with as many ticket-type machines as we could, which were all IGT, over 90% of the floor. The property so far has been – to my knowledge – the best opening and best-run casino in operations. That part of it, ticket-in/ticket-out – smooth as a kitten. It's a brand new property with no issues. Terrible Herbst also did it. The Palms has done it, and Green Valley Ranch, so ticketing is definitely here to stay. People have accepted it very, very well. That's not a complaint with customers."

**IGT:** Why do you think it's been more of a difficult transition for places that didn't have it?

**Suan:** "The only other place we have – we're converting half the floor at the Orleans and half the floor at the Gold Coast [to the *EZ Pay* Ticket System] – we're slowing down because the type of machines, the multi-game, multi-denomination is a different format, different layout than the old 13" *Player's Edge* machines. We're getting more comments about that than ticketing. Actually, we haven't had any complaints about ticketing..."


**IGT:** What's your favorite poker game?

**Suan:** "If you're looking for the most popular poker machine on the floor, it's the standard *Double Double Bonus Poker* game. That's probably the most popular machine in the history of gaming. That and *Triple Play Poker* are the best machines on the floor, no doubt. You don't want to have too many of them, though; you don't want to saturate the floor. Not everybody likes to play them, but the win-per-day is definitely the biggest on the floor."

Thanks, Marcus, for sharing your insights. Coast Resorts casinos are a great success story in themselves, and IGT is proud to be represented so well with slots and video poker games, and the *EZ Pay* Ticket System.
