

## No Holiday for Video Poker



## **Poker Rules at the Global Gaming Expo**



Fifty-one weeks to prepare, then five quick days and it's over. Whew! Visitors at the September 2002 Global Gaming Expo at the Las Vegas Convention Center were treated to what may be the largest gaming show ever, with over 600 exhibitors covering 190,400 square feet of exhibit space. The IGT and Action Gaming booths straddled an impressive expanse of this real estate between the two main entrances to the exhibit hall, making it a logical first stop for arriving attendees, and a "last chance" stop on the way out.

Themed the IGT Experience, our booth featured subdued overhead lighting that enhanced the dramatic effect of the colorfully



another machine, and that on average 4% of printed tickets "walk," although he said these are usually small amounts and don't help the hold too much. So much for <u>that</u> ticket myth...

- The panel agreed that determining how loose a game should be is often dictated by the amenities offered by the gaming site. For an older casino with few comp outlets, price is the leading point of competition. For a casino with nice outlets, restaurants and shops, paytables don't have to be as loose. The most important factor is that casinos need to take care of their customers...
- Bob Dancer commented that playing in Atlantic City is not as bad as most people may think, IF you know what you're doing and can visit frequently enough to benefit from their "bounce back" promotions...
- Bob Dancer also suggested that casinos' animosity toward video poker pros is often misplaced. It's essential that casinos be healthy and profitable so that people who make a

living playing video poker have a place to play. He suggests a symbiotic relationship...

- Marcus Suan admitted he's not crazy about pros hanging out at his properties, but he doesn't actually discourage the honest professional. What he won't tolerate is team players who gang up on a big progressive jackpot that has been funded by his loyal and frequent patrons. In these instances, Marcus will ask the team folks to back off, clearly demonstrating his commitment to his players, and acknowledging their right to win...
- Bob Sobczyk "confessed" that he uses the consulting services of professional gamblers in order to ensure that he has a balance of attractive pay schedules, comp club benefits, and player friendliness. In other words, keep your friends close and your "enemies" closer. (Editor's note: we wonder if Sun Tzu's "The Art of War" is Bob's favorite book)...
- And finally, it was confirmed by all of the panelists that video poker, as a percentage of your floor, always grows as markets mature, and the sooner you get on-board, the sooner you can develop this loyal and profitable player segment!



## Video Poker Takes a New Twist With Trade Up Poker™

The *Trade Up Poker* game plays like regular *Triple Play* or *Five Play* video poker, but with a novel twist: sometimes you're given the option to trade three or five starting hands for at least twice as many hands. Trading up is always a good idea when you have the choice, as the trade-up option adds between 1.4% and 3.1% to the base paytable.

The game opens with a regular *Triple Play/Five Play* multi-hand game format with a variety of game choices, including *Jacks or Better, Bonus Poker, Bonus Poker Deluxe, Double Bonus Poker*, and *Double Double Bonus Poker*. A dealt 3-of-a-kind (a once in 47-hands event), and some or all dealt full houses (a once in 700-hands to once in 9,000-hands event, depending...) brings up the option to exchange that hand for at least twice as many identical hands in which the 3-of-a-kind must be held. A look at the available pay schedules will help illustrate which hands trigger the Trade Up option.

Figure 1 shows the *Triple Play*, 8/6 *Jacks or Better, Trade Up Poker* game with a dealt hand of trip aces. Holding the three aces is the best play by far. Under the normal version of *Triple Play*, on each hand we have a 6.1% chance to draw a full house worth 40, a 4.3% chance of getting 4-of-a-kind worth 125, and the other 89.6% of the time we end up with the trips we started with, worth 15.

In the *Trade Up Poker* theme, we have the option of giving up the normal three hands and receiving TEN hands in their stead,

as shown in Figure 2. We still have the same 6.1% and 4.3% chance to get the full house and the 4-of-a-kind on each hand.

but after the trade we receive nothing when the 3-of-a-kind hands don't improve.

We could lose on this trade up. In 41% of all times we draw to ten 3-of-a-kinds we'll end up with the same ten 3-of-a-kinds we started with. On those occasions, we'll have lost 45 coins by trading up, because each of the three original 3-of-a-kinds would have paid 15 coins when they didn't improve. The remaining 59% of the

time, we'll score at least one full house and possibly up to several quads. We'll improve on three or more of the trips about 4% of the time. Overall, this is a good deal. Refusing the trade-up option leaves us with a 98.39% game. Taking the trade-up option every time it's offered creates a 100.36% game. It doesn't take a rocket scientist to realize that you should press the "Always Trade Up" button.

In Figure 3 we've drawn both a single full house and a single quad. Upgrading exactly two of the trips – including both being full houses or both being quads – happens about 16% of the time.

Figure 4 shows the same hand in the 8/5 Bonus Poker Deluxe game. When accepting the trade-up option here (Figure 5), we only receive SIX hands starting from trips, rather than the TEN hands we had in the Jacks or Better game. That's because when we connect on 4-of-a-kinds in the Bonus Poker Deluxe game we receive 400 coins, rather than the 125 coins we receive when playing Jacks or Better video poker. Since it's so much more lucrative to connect on the quad, we're offered fewer chances in the bonus. Even so, always taking the trade up option when offered turns a 97.40%

game into one worth 99.94%. Again, it's a no-brainer to always accept the option.

Depending on the game family, sometimes you're given a choice to Trade Up full houses. The pay schedule gives the complete rules for this, but you don't need to worry about it. Just follow the rule to ALWAYS trade up when offered the chance.

Will I personally play this game? Absolutely, providing the pay schedule is lucrative enough given a casino's slot club and promotions. I like this game a lot, but if a casino offers a less-than-acceptable pay schedule, I simply won't play.

## A Suit Fit For A King



Did you know that at one time, the king of hearts represented

Charlemagne, the king of diamonds was Julius Caesar, the king of clubs was Alexander the Great, and the king of spades was King David from the Bible? These fascinating identities, along with special designations for the other court cards, were bestowed by the French who were instrumental in bringing the pleasures of card play to people in Europe and in the New World.

While researching this lineage of the kings for this issue of *The Inside Straight* newsletter, we learned another interesting playing card fact we felt worth sharing with you:

The ace of spades served a famous purpose in the war in Vietnam. In February of 1966, two lieutenants of Company "C," Second Battalion, 35th Regiment, 25th Infantry Division, wrote The United States Playing Card Company (USPC) and requested decks of cards containing nothing but the "Bicycle" ace of spades. The cards were useful in psychological warfare. The Viet Cong were very superstitious and highly frightened by this ace. The French previously had occupied Indo-China, and in French fortune telling with cards, the spades predicted death and suffering. The Viet Cong even regarded lady liberty as a goddess of death. USPC shipped thousands of the requested decks gratis

to our troops in Vietnam. These decks were housed in plain white tuckcases, inscribed "Bicycle Secret Weapon." The cards were deliberately scattered in the jungle and in hostile villages during raids. The very sight of the "Bicycle" ace was said to cause many Viet Cong to flee.

As good managers, it's a challenge to come up with ways to teach our employees things and make learning fun. This may be alien to many, but if you remember back in school, our favorite teachers were always the ones who made boring old history/science/biology fun. I believe this concept is true in all our roles, and I'd like to suggest a fun, interesting way to reward some of your better employees – or yourself - while learning some fascinating and important things about our mutual customers... poker players.

Two books are coming to bookstores soon that will truly get you inside your players' heads. Jean Scott, author of "The Frugal Gambler," is releasing a sequel this fall. Her original book was the first really easy read on how to assess and exploit comp programs, and her newest book picks up where that one left off. Jean and her husband travel the U.S.A., know gambling inside out, and most importantly are teaching your players how to work the system. gone the "If you can't beat 'em, join 'em" route. This book makes my toes curl just to read about how hard he worked at playing poker to avoid having a "real job." If you want to understand professional players and how they think, this book's for you.

I'm convinced that to understand games, we have to play them with money, not using the "gaff" button at a show. And to understand players, we have to hang with them.

These two books will save you a lot of time, dry cleaning, and sanity, and I recommend them to you and your staff, as I have to our team and our IGT sales reps.



## Those Elusive "Available When?" Dates...

One of the most frustrating things for both suppliers and casinos alike has to be the question: When will the game <u>really</u> be released? Everyone has cool games, but they never seem to be available when you're ready to buy.

Well, sadly, we have some of the same problems as other manufacturers, and the "available when" dates for a few games seen at the show have changed. However, rather than blame it on gaming authorities – which some see as an easy target – we'd rather be right upfront about explaining what happened, to give you an inside look at the mechanics of delivering great games.

**Double Down Stud Poker** This game was really popular and remembered fondly. The fivebuck price went over well, too! However, we got some great feedback on it during the show. One excellent suggestion was that we should add the dealt winner message on-screen, as we do in the Triple Play Draw Poker game, where a dealt winning hand is highlighted in a box with the credits won. We agree that this will make the game more understandable for first-timers. A number of people correctly pointed out that we need an easy-to-order custom button panel with only the available selection options, so that's under way, too. We're going to add both of these features and a few other refinements. The net result is that the *Double Down Stud* Poker theme will probably not be available until March.

*Trade Up Poker* This was also very well received, but several people thought we should make the gamble-within-the-gamble easier to understand. If a player is giving up a guaranteed winning hand, they should know that clearly. The upshot is, we're changing the glass and changing some of the messages within the game to make it clear and easier to understand. This moves the Trade Up *Poker* theme out into the mid-February range.

Fast Action Draw Poker You know what? We found a bug. No excuses. So we had to move the release date out to around January.

Whether you care or not, we wanted to give you a little insight into some of the factors that can affect our production schedules. We'd be fools not to use your input from the show, of course, and to put a game out there that has less than the best possible chance of succeeding is a waste of both our time and your conversion dollars.
