Four Aces Conduct Progressive Gaming Panel at G2E

Some of the usual suspects were corralled at G2E for a panel focused on how to make money using progressives – without getting stung by pros and vultures, and having your locals suffer.



Panelists included Cliff Paige, Director of Slot Operations, Gold Coast Casino; Sean Evans of Aristocrat, who's had experience with progressives in some of their games; Bob Dancer, prolific poker author and professional player; and IGT's very own Mike Fields, self-confessed lover of progressive video poker games.

Some Panel highlights for those who missed it:

- Progressives are harder to play perfectly, without a calculator, and as such are less susceptible in many cases to pros, offered Bob Dancer. Professional players want games they can practice and play for hours without strategy deviation.
- Dancer also pointed out that there are pros who regularly troll some properties and call in the troops when certain high denomination progressive jackpots get to certain levels. This brings a whole new meaning to "slot route," huh?

- When barring pros from your games, Dancer suggested that you always do so professionally, privately, and as pleasantly as possible, and cited a number of highly visible cases where players were – correctly or incorrectly – barred from casinos, resulting in some negative publicity.
- To make meters move, it was suggested that it is better to progress only one jackpot, but several people agreed there is a lot of emotion surrounding play for four aces when they top \$900 on a dollar Double Bonus Poker game, or a game where the straight flush is progressed and hits the \$300 mark. These emotions drive play, loyalty and profit.
- When determining what games to progress, it was suggested that you progress your most popular games, match your competition, and then offer one unique game that no one else has as a "product differentiator."
- When progressives get "ripe," sometimes jackpot followers take over seats on games keeping them from a casino's loyal, frequent players. This can be a challenge



to manage, and we've heard of one clever idea where a casino kept a "Who's got next" list - like at a basketball game - with the casino's top patrons getting seating priority based on their player card levels. Obviously, this ensures the right people get their shot, and is worth it on a high dollar game to keep your best players happy.




Slot machines or TVs?

A Boatload Of Fun

Every now and then, I find it extremely useful to get the heck out of Nevada, away from our own company and into the field to rub elbows with players and operators from different jurisdictions. I love having players explain their favorite games to me, and how the paylines work, even if they don't really know.

I recently had a chance to go to what has become one of my favorite boats, the Ameristar St. Charles on the Missouri River, and found some very interesting, innovative, and effective things, not to mention some yummy food options. Here are a few highlights of the trip that I think are worth sharing:

Progressives

These guys got 'em — in nickels, quarters, and dollars — AND in the *Triple Play* format... all making money and all with a regular following. I especially liked their use of plasma displays. Not only did they often display the jackpot — the "greed message" — but they also advertised upcoming events and promotions. I haven't seen this tool used much outside of Las Vegas, but it sure seemed to work on this beautiful boat.

Multi-denom

Lots of operators offer defined denominations, or limited denominations, but Ameristar offers as many as six denoms on many of their poker games. I found this especially interesting and noted that as the day went along, the denomination played seemed to move up. It seems offering more pricing options accommodates a wider range of players, satisfying those that might not have found a game to play were it not for this flexibility. Clever.

Tickets

Tickets everywhere. I really liked this. I remember my early trips to the Midwest and it drove me crazy reverting back and handling those filthy coins. The players I talked to love tickets, and they seemed to be on everything – poker, video slots, and reel games. Using tickets on *Fifty Play* and *Hundred Play* games seemed to work like a charm, as I rarely saw an empty seat!

Game selection

These guys have a great mix of product and even a few poker games that could entice me, without them being so over-the-top as to attract the pros. They offer lots of poker families and a great selection of multi-hand products, again in lots of denominations.

Great job, Ameristar, and kudos to Jim Franke, Vice President of Casino Operations!



The Five Aces Bonus Poker game is gonna be a star! This simple, yet elegant, improvement to the game is nothing more complicated than adding a fifth ace to the deck, making it a 53-card deck with tons more ace combos.

In many jurisdictions, The *Double Double Bonus Poker* theme is the most popular game around. Players love the kickers and they love their aces, as they do in the *Double Bonus Poker* game.



The Five Aces Bonus Poker game, as you can see from the pay schedule, is really a lot like the most popular Double Double Bonus Poker theme — only a little bit better — especially if you love aces.

Players still get their kicker combos for 2,000 and 800 coins, but they also get the chance to nail five aces and get a 150% payout on the top award, over a traditional royal. In dollars, that's \$6,000! In quarters, it's \$1,500!

All that fun is paid for with one coin from the three-of-a-kind, and one off the straight, and we know players do crazy things to get their "kicks!"



Whoever said, "Do one thing and do it well," never played Triple Play Poker.



Play three hands at a time. Play twelve different games. Play as fast as you like. Do it all on one machine. That's the kind of excitement Triple Play™ Poker dishes out. Look for it at your favorite casino.

Also try your hand at Ten Play[™], Fifty Play[™] and Hundred Play[™] Poker, and Chase The Royal[™], an intense new game with four times the royal flushes as traditional video poker games.
