



The IGT Progressive Controller By John Daley

The wait is over – it's finally here... the IGT Progressive Controller (in most jurisdictions anyway).

And just what's so special about the IGT Progressive Controller (IPC)? Lots, but we'll keep it simple and just tell you about the "biggies," and we'll do it in plain English. Sure, the techs will dig all the intricate

details, but what <u>you</u> want to know is the "why" and "how" of using the IPC to make more money. Here are my two favorite things:




One important feature is that now you can set up progressive jackpots for more than one denomination in the same box, versus the old way of just having one denomination progressed. (See sample screen above.) If you want to make that box full of options for your players – and profits opportunities for the house – you can. Progress

quarters, halves and dollars – all on the same machine! And all with only one controller.

2. Multiple, independent jackpot categories – again – in the same machine.

Independent Jackpot Families

This impressive feature allows you to progress independent game families in the same box (see screen example above). In the old days, you were limited to only one game family and a specific number of progressive jackpots. Typically, you'd progress *Double Bonus Poker* for the royal flush, aces, twos through fours, and fives through kings. You might offer the *Jacks or Better Poker* family with a royal flush progressive. The *Double Double Bonus Poker®* game would be similar to the *Double Bonus Poker* group, but with the extra kicker jackpots. Using the IGT Progressive Controller, you can literally create progressive jackpots for <u>all</u> of these game families, featuring different jackpot categories on the same machine, with one controller. Is that hot or what?!

You'll find plenty of other cool features – such as one controller can manage up to 63 machines – but the first two are my personal favorites.

A Capital Idea



Carson City, Nevada's capital, is now home to the newly opened and very elegant Casino Fandango, operated by Larry Woolf, formerly of the MGM Grand in Las Vegas, and Caesars Tahoe. Casino Fandango opened its doors in August with five table games, plus 175 slot machines all featuring ticketin ticket-out. Under the direction of General Manager Steve Forester, the property expanded to 430 machines and ten tables on Christmas Eve, and has plans for four restaurants, seven bars, and hundreds more machines in the months ahead when the 65,000 square foot casino is completed.

So why is this place special and why has it enjoyed such growth in a market many consider "tired" or "doomed because of California's growth?" From a player's perspective, Casino Fandango has created some truly unique features, and the service is great. What isn't so obvious is what players experience at the subconscious level.

First, the whole casino is 100% tickets. It just doesn't get much easier than that. Tickets mean convenience and customer freedom. With tickets growing so fast, this drum needs no further beating.

Second, these guys did something we absolutely love. Trusting the keen insight of Reno architect Pete Wilday for the design of the casino and slot stands, they installed shorterthan-usual 14" tall stands (patents pending) for upright machines, and shortened the cabinets on their slant-top machines throughout the casino. (Being 100% TITO, no coin drop boxes are needed,

so machines can sit closer to the floor.) There are two things this does for their floor and players. The most immediate benefit is C-O-M-F-O-R-T.

With machine buttons at wrist level, players can sit with their feet flat on the floor and their arms comfortably resting on the bolster, buttons within easy reach. A comfortable player plays longer. Is your casino this comfortable? (Take Mike Fields' easy two-step test outlined in the sidebar and find out for yourself!)

On the subconscious level, players enjoy a great line-of-sight above the low profile banks of machines. Such openness just "feels" right. Players can find their favorite game, the restroom, or the buffet quicker, without standing on a slot stand or wandering aimlessly. This is all good, especially for local players.

You can wallow in technology and agonize over reports, or you can focus on the basics. Larry Woolf has been doing this for years and has done it yet again.

Next time you're at the south end of Carson City, stop in at Casino Fandango. Enjoy live entertainment at the Cabaret stage and dance floor, check out the gaming action and special effects at the Infinity Pool, and while you're at it, play a little video poker!

Field Test For EZ Money

Are you tiring out your players and costing yourself "that next twenty?" Take this simple two-step test to experience your customers' comfort and play experience.

- 1. First, sit at your desk and note where your wrists fall in relationship to your keyboard. Are they a) Level with the keyboard? b) Above the keyboard? Or c) Under the keyboard? If they're under it, and you're reaching up to type, you probably already know how tiring this can be when working for an extended period of time. Well, the same is true for players who are selecting betting options or holding cards.
- 2. Now, get out of your office and sit at a machine or two. Pretend you're a player, and gauge your comfort level. Where do your wrists fall? If you or your players are "reaching up," then you're making your players tired. And tired players move on sooner than comfortable ones.

Optimal slot-stand height combined with an ergonomic seat height make a huge difference in how long a player will sit and play. Remember to take your height into account too. In my experience, I often have to reach up to play and it wears me out when I'm on a roll. "Come on quad! I want to cash out—I'm tired." I bail with money in my pocket because it just isn't comfortable. Considering I'm 6' 2" and must usually reach up to hit the buttons, how do you suppose this feels for the typical 5' 4" player?

Give shorter stands a try, particularly if you're under way with tickets. Don't wear out your players. Casino Fandango sure doesn't!



Wide Area Marketing Test Results

Before they're officially released, our new games are brought before a tough panel of judges – real casino players – in a diverse cross section of Nevada casinos. We call this ongoing ritual our Wide Area Marketing (WAM) test, and it lasts four rigorous weeks. Through the magic of meters and modems and mathematicians, the performance of each new game is compared daily against comparable control games located in the same WAM test sites.

When the results are in, we can usually give you a pretty good idea of how well a particular game will fare in your casino. Some recent results we thought you'd like to see include the *Multi-Hand Blackjack*, *Hold 'Em Challenge*, and *Five Aces Poker* games.

WAM results for the *Multi-Hand Blackjack* game show this is performing best in high denominations, and is getting good results at casinos on the Strip. Although it started a little slower in off-Strip properties, after four weeks of testing, the play increased steadily each week. We expect this game will ultimately attract a stable player base, although due to the nature of Blackjack



players, it may take a little longer to build this base than we've seen with conventional video poker games.

There's no bluffing with the Hold 'Em Challenge game; this theme is dealing operators something new indeed!
The game concept is one that players have not seen on a slot machine, but with all of the exposure live poker is getting on television, this game is sure to attract players and build an excited following. This game is performing well in



those "hard to make work" areas outside of poker rooms, and keeping players near the tables! Player interest has been piqued by the vast amount of live Hold 'Em poker on television, and this game is an easy way for the novice to ease into learning how to play Hold 'Em without a bunch of experienced players sitting around the table intimidating the "new guy."

The Super Times Pay Poker game is growing a "super" following of its own, and continues to perform well above the



area and denomination averages! With no change in game strategy, players love the multipliers, and are happy to bet the extra coin to be eligible for them. This theme is fast becoming a must-have on the floor, with hundreds out there and more to follow. Do you have yours?

IGT's Reel Touch™ Series is "Most Innovative Product of 2003"

Attendees at the American Gaming Summit in Las Vegas have honored IGT's *Reel Touch* Series of gaming machines as the "Most Innovative Product of 2003." The competition, now in its seventh year, begins with a list of products submitted by various companies in the industry.
