

Bright Lights Come to Pennsylvania

Harrah's Chester Casino & Racetrack sports more than 2,700 slots and video poker machines in over 100,000 square feet of gaming space, plus acres of pulse-pounding horse racing action on the 5/8-mile track.

After a long wait and a lengthy approval process, November 2006 marked the opening of the first racino (horse racing track with a casino) in Pennsylvania history. By the time this publication reaches you, there will be five tracks open for business across the state.

Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs was the first to open, followed by PhiladelphiaPark Casino and Racetrack outside of the city; Harrah's Chester Casino & Racetrack in Chester, PA; Presque Isle Downs in Erie; and finally The Meadows Racetrack & Casino outside of Pittsburgh. Hollywood Casino at Penn National Race Course in Grantville, PA is currently being built and is scheduled to open in December of 2007. When all is said and done, the state may have a total of up to 61,000 slot machines.

Imagine what you can do in Pittsburgh, now that gaming has come to Pennsylvania!

The video poker market in Pennsylvania is off to a strong start. To date, the tracks range from 7%+ to almost 14% poker. The game mix is varied and the paytables are on the tighter side. So far, most of the casinos offer a progressive, with Harrah's taking the cake for the largest video poker sign I have ever seen (see the back wall in the photo below)!

Although Pennsylvania is a new market, the players, for the most part, are familiar with gaming and have learned the ropes from Atlantic City over the years. Spin Poker™ is a very strong game in Atlantic City, and coincidentally is one of the top producers in Pennsylvania as well. It will be interesting to see how this market unfolds and what trends we will see in Pennsylvania over the months and years to come.

The next phase in Pennsylvania gaming involves casinos under Category 2 licenses that were recently awarded. These casinos are freestanding and can have up to 5,000 slot machines. Although a legal battle is brewing over some locations, the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board granted these hotly-contested licenses to Foxwoods Casino in Philadelphia, Don Barden for his Majestic Star casino on Pittsburgh's North Shore, Sugarhouse Casino on Philly's Delaware waterfront, Mount Airy (Lodge) Resort & Casino in the Pocono Mountains, and Sands BethWorks in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. We should see the first of these Category 2 licenses open sometime in 2008.

According to Adam McElrath, Assistant General Manager of the recently-opened Reno, Nevada Buffalo Wild Wings® Restaurant and Bar, "Our gaming customers really benefit from these LCD-screen poker machines. With all the neon bar signs and colored lights we use for decoration, there's very little of that reflected in the bar top screens. Players see the game and not the glare. We're fortunate here in that our Reno restaurant is one of the few Buffalo Wild Wings® located in an area where gaming is allowed."

Local Poker Progressives Made Easy

We've all walked a casino floor at times and noticed banks of progressives running on LCD or plasma displays. Operators across the country are using big and colorful screens to showcase jackpot values and create excitement. This is achieved using an interface commonly referred to as a media controller – a sort of "middleman" needed to interface between the IGT Progressive Controller (IPC) and your LCD or plasma screen so it knows what to display.

In the past, it was necessary to go to several companies to assemble a package like this. In response to requests by our customers, IGT now provides media controllers as well as progressive controllers, in order to make things easier for you. The IGT Media Controller – or IMC – is IGT's new progressive display solution, making IGT your onestop shop for media and progressive controllers. Now you can create and run compelling and profitable merchandising concepts on your display screens... seamlessly.

In the words of our friends in IGT Casino Services, "The IMC is a compact computer utilizing the Microsoft® Windows® XP Professional™ operating system. It's loaded with IGT's proprietary software that runs from the hard drive. The IMC delivers high-quality video and sound to the displays and speakers in the customer's sign. It can also control optional flashing lights mounted on the sign. The IMC is a slave device that receives data from the IGT Progressive Controller to display the various progressive levels, bonus event demonstrations, and the attract presentation. It does not determine the progressive values or the cycle time between bonus events."

By combining the IPC and IMC, you can offer great things to your video poker players. For example, you can give players a first class multi-denomination and multi-game progressive with choices such as progressives for Double Double Bonus Poker® and Double Bonus Poker® in 25¢, 50¢ and \$1 while offering 3 or 4 other game families as non-progressives. This setup is ideal in a bar environment, and can be connected to a few banks on the floor as well.

Typically players think they're playing just one progressive on the bank or bar where they're sitting,



when in actuality they're linked with the action generated by players at several other banks. This arrangement allows the progressed jackpot categories to rise very quickly. Additional players chasing the progressives always add an exciting and profitable element.

When you provide multiple denominations, you allow players to move up in the denomination scale if they catch a good hand. Reinforced by won credits, a player who hits four-of-a-kind 5s through kings while playing quarters may be inclined to move up to 50¢ or \$1 for the next set of hands. This also keeps the player in his or her seat enjoying the game longer rather than going to the cage and cashing out.

Another powerful feature is the display of progressive meters that cycle at operator-configurable intervals set through the IMC. Each IPC can progress up to 63 machines and 32 levels, and can highlight up to 8 different levels on a single screen display. By linking multiple IPCs, you can now expand the progressive system you are currently running.

The IMC for video poker is now approved and available.
